## Day 1 - Mexico City Arrival – Saturday

Upon arrival transfer from Mexico City airport and transfer to the hotel, free afternoon.

Welcome dinner.

## Day 2 - Tacos and Mezcal – Sunday

Breakfast at the hotel. Afterwards, the group will depart to the

Anthropology Museum of Mexico City, the guide will explain everything about this incredible museum, considered one of the largest in space and collection in America.

At the end you will make a tour to taste the typical Mexican tacos, as well as the mezcal. Tacos and Mezcal play a very important part in Mexico's cuisine, so today you'll be able to enjoy a total new experience, since the guide will accompany you and explain every detail that you need to know about Tacos and Mezcal.

## Day 3. Puebla – Monday

Breakfast at the hotel. At the appointed hour the group will meet in the lobby to board the bus and leave for Puebla, beautiful State of Mexico where they will be able to see more Mexican art. The first stop will be the ex-convent of Santa Rosa, a former convent famous for its history and for leaving the legacy of mole (Mexican food).

After leaving the ex-convent the group will walk the streets of

Puebla, the Plaza de Armas and the Cathedral. We have not forgotten that this day the group has learned about mole and that is why they will visit a local restaurant famous for its mole where they will be able to taste such an exquisite dish. Once the food is finished the group will get on the bus and go to visit a Talavería. The Talavera poblana is a very popular craft, after the conquest the poblanos started to make their own designs and created a talavera very different from the original one, allowing this way to make it unique. In the Talavera Shop you can learn the art of the Mexican Talavera, here you will have a tour and you can talk with the artisans about their work. Don't forget to do some shopping.

Return to Mexico City and free night.

## Day 4. Huamantla – Tuesday

Breakfast at the hotel. Early departure to Huamantla, where you will learn how to make the typical muéganos (sweet bread of the region), and the group will be able to participate in the elaboration.

Afterwards, you will have a workshop of the local crafts called "tapetes". The original rugs are made in the month of August and with sawdust they decorate the streets of Huamantla, approximately 10 km of decorations.

Once your workshop is over you will head to Tlaxcala,

where you will enjoy a delicious meal and taste the famous pulque. After the meal there is going to be free time to wonder around the streets of Tlaxcala. Return to Mexico City. Free night.

### Day 5. Xochimilco – Wednesday

Breakfast at the hotel. At the appointed hour the group will gather in the lobby to departure Xochimilco and arrive at Chantico restaurant, where the group will have a pre-Hispanic cooking demo, learn about pre-Hispanic ingredients and have fun while asking, watching and participating in the cooking. And as it should be, once the dishes are finished we will go out to the pier where you will board a trajinera (typical boat of Xochimilco) and here on the tour you will taste the food you have cooked, to the sound of local mariachi music.

And the day is not over yet, on the way back to Mexico City we will have the canteen tour, where we will visit the oldest canteens in the city and will be able to have a drink in each establishment. Then again the guide will explain the history on every canteen making this tour perfect for those that enjoy a good drink and lecture. Return to the hotel.

### Day 6. Zocalo – Thursday

Breakfast at the hotel. Once again the group will gather at the lobby and board their bus and departure to the National Palace, the guide will explain the murals of Diego Rivera and the most important details of the Palace. Next to the Templo Mayor and its museum, a tour in the ruins of the Templo Mayor will be enough to understand the beauty of this incredible place.

Once finished, you will board the bus to the San Juan Market, known for its sale and preparation of exotic food. There will be free time and you will return to the hotel. Free afternoon and farewell dinner.

### Day 7. Return home – Friday

Breakfast at the hotel. At the appointed hour the group will check out at the counter, then they will board the bus and departure to the airport to take their flight home.
